## Full Primary and Intermediate Schools Competition



**Objective:** To allow students from JUMP JAM licensed schools to participate and experience competition, confidence building, fun, fitness and leadership opportunities.

### Related Achievement Objectives:

#### Physical Education and Health

*Strand D* – Students will participate in communal events and describe how Such events enhance the well-being of the community.

*Communicating Ideas in Dance* - Students will present dance with awareness Of a performance context.

## Rules and Guidelines

### ***Open to JUMP JAM Licensed Schools only***

JUMP JAM licensed Schools may **compete** using any one JUMP JAM song/routine that its school has licensed.

The JUMP JAM Challenge for 2010 will be held via Video Entry (VHS Video tape or DVD). **Final date for entry is Monday 21 June 2010.** Those teams that qualify will be invited to the **NATIONAL FINAL to be held on Saturday 20 November 2010 in Taupo. (Venue: Taupo Events Centre).**

### **Year Level: (See Category Definitions page attached page nine)**

**NOVICE** is defined as a school that's **NEVER** qualified to be in the National Final in 2008 or 2009 in the category they are entering for in 2010. Please note, your school may have qualified to be in the National Final either 2008 or 2009 National final in say the Yr 2-6 category, however in 2010 you wish to enter a Yr 7 /8 team, so you would enter as a **NOVICE** in this category. **Please note: Years 2-6 Category in previous years now translates in 2010 to Years 4-6 Category.**

**OPEN** is defined as any school that has made a National Final in 2008 or 2009 in the category they are entering in 2010. (See list of schools attached on page ten and eleven). **Please note: Years 2-6 Category in previous years now translates in 2010 to Years 4-6 Category.**

- **Year 1, 2, 3 & 4 Primary NOVICE** (composite team, your team must consist of at least 50% either Year 1, 2 OR 3 with the remaining 50% Year 4 students).
- **Year 1, 2, 3 & 4 Primary OPEN** (composite team, your team must consist of at least 50% either Year 1, 2 OR 3 with the remaining 50% Year 4 students).
- **Year 4 – 6 Primary NOVICE** (composite team, i.e. all the same year, or a mixture of year levels).
- **Year 4 – 6 Primary OPEN** (composite team, i.e. all the same year, or a mixture of year levels).
- **Year 4 - 6 Primary All Boys Team** (composite team, i.e. all the same year, or a mixture.).
- **Year 7/8 Full Primary/Intermediate NOVICE** (composite team, i.e. all same year or a mixture).
- **Year 7/8 Full Primary/Intermediate OPEN** (composite team, i.e. all same year or a mixture).
- **Year 7/8 Full Primary/Intermediate All Boys Team** (composite team, i.e. all same year or a mixture).

### **You may enter:**

Any number of team entries per category. Team size – minimum **6 students**, maximum **12 students**. **If you choose to enter more than 1 team per category only the highest point scoring team per category will qualify for Nationals.** If schools want to enter more than 1 team, and you wish to use the same students from another team, a maximum of 2 students can swap from 1 team to another. i.e: you wish to have an All Boy's Team and a mixed team you can only have 2 boys from the Boy's Team in the mixed team.



**Who qualifies for the National Final and when is the closing date for entry?**

For 2010 we are taking 50 teams through to the Nationals Finals in Taupo Saturday 20 November 2010.

- ❑ **The Top 5 schools in the Year 1,2,3,4 Primary NOVICE** categories will be invited to compete in the JUMP JAM National event.
  - ❑ **The Top 5 schools in the Year 1,2,3,4 Primary OPEN** categories will be invited to compete in the JUMP JAM National event.
  - ❑ **The Top 15 schools in the Year 4-6 Primary NOVICE** category will be invited to compete in the JUMP JAM National event of which the top 5 **BRAND NEW** schools will qualify. A **BRAND NEW** school is defined as a school, which has **NEVER** put in an entry to any JUMP JAM CHALLENGE at DVD/Video level in any category in any year previously.
  - ❑ **The Top 5 schools in the Year 4-6 Primary OPEN** category will be invited to compete in the JUMP JAM National event.
  - ❑ **The Top 5 schools in the Year 4-6 Primary All Boys Team** category will be invited to compete in the JUMP JAM National event.
  - ❑ **The Top 5 schools in the Year 7/8 Full Primary/Intermediate NOVICE** category will be invited to compete in the JUMP JAM National event.
  - ❑ **The Top 5 schools in the Year 7/8 Full Primary/Intermediate OPEN** category will be invited to compete in the JUMP JAM National event.
  - ❑ **The Top 5 schools in the Year 7/8 Full Primary/Intermediate All Boys Team** category will be invited to compete in the JUMP JAM National event.
- Entries must be **couriered & received by Monday 21 June 2010**. You will be emailed confirmation on receipt of your entry. If no confirmation is received by **Wednesday 23 June** please phone our office on 0800 348 543 (0800 FIT KID).

**What Filming Format Is Required?**

- **Either VHS VIDEO tape or DVD for higher quality (details below).**
- If choosing DVD, the recording should be converted to **DVD-R** as opposed to DVD+R.
- We recommend the following DVD-R disc brands 'Verbatim', 'Mitsubishi' or 'TDK'.
- **Do not** use Rewriteable DVD's or CD Rom's.
- **Please test** in at least 2 DVD players (not computers).
- **Clearly label** your VHS VIDEO tape or DVD with School name, Team Name & which category entered.

**Guidelines for Filming**

- Good natural lighting is essential. Limit shadows over performer's faces & bodies.
- Use a clean backdrop e.g. a Curtain. Or remove all visible clutter.
- Use a single camera shot from the front / middle of room.
- Use a tight frame from left to right side of picture. All team members need to be in the frame at all times. Remember we need to see faces so get as close as possible without chopping anyone out. Film tight so we can see all faces in your team. **TIP: For the video round keep team spacing and patterns tight. Keep within a 6X6m square frame for your staging/filming area. A common problem for judging is when teams use a bigger stage area and/or the spacing's are wide, it is difficult to see all team members' faces/expressions clearly.**
- A live audience may assist with atmosphere. Please note, the team should be seen clearly at all times, from head to toe. Consider elevating the team and/or seating the audience. We should also be able to hear the music over any audience noise.

**Team Entry Fee (This covers certificates, all admin expenses plus time to judge/write feedback/post/file etc)**

- Entry fee for Video Entry will be **\$45 per team**.
- Entry fee for the teams who qualify for the National Final will be **\$45 per team**.
- Cheques are payable to Kidz Aerobix Ltd, 4/267 Oceanbeach Rd, Mt Maunganui. **One cheque per school. Please send with couriered entry.**

**When & how will we know who qualifies for the National Final?**

- All entries will be emailed a feedback form and their score by the end of Week 1, Term 3, 2010. The top qualifiers will also be placed on our website [www.kidzaerobix.com](http://www.kidzaerobix.com) plus will be emailed to confirm their invitation to the National Final.



### Awards & Prizes

- All students will receive a 2010 JUMP JAM CHALLENGE Participation Certificate.
- The **top 5-point scorers in each** category throughout NZ will receive one JUMP JAM Resource Kit for their school chosen by Kidz Aerobix. If multiple teams from the same school make the top 5 point scores each team will receive a JUMP JAM Resource Kit for their school but only the top point scoring team from that school will be invited to the National event. ie: if your school had 2 teams entered and one team came 3<sup>rd</sup> and the other team came 5<sup>th</sup>. both teams will receive a JUMP JAM resource kit for their school but only the highest scoring team will be invited to attend the National event.
- National Final trophies and National Final certificates will be given to Schools that place 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. National Final trophies and Medals will be given to Schools that place 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup>.

### Music

- Choose one original JUMP JAM song in its original length from any JUMP JAM Resource Kit, which your school has licensed. At the National Final, the organisers will supply music on the day.

### Choreography

- Changes to JUMP JAM choreography is *permitted* up to a **maximum of one third (1/3)** at Video Entry and National Level, however **choreography changes will only be judged at the National Final.** With both Video Entry and the National Final, if *more than 1/3* of the JUMP JAM choreography is changed, 1 point will be deducted. **Tip: Time the changes in minutes/seconds. Always go back to the original JUMP JAM video/DVD to compare what is a change. If in doubt you are best to stick to the original choreography for video entry, as changes will not be judged.**

### Costumes and Props

- For Video Entry, uniformity is encouraged e.g. school sports uniforms, black shorts/pants and white tops etc. Please note, be wary of coloured backdrops when filming, as you don't want your team to blend in with possible surroundings. You can wear costumes if you wish but there is no need to spend large amounts of money on this, as your team may not qualify for the National Event.
- For National level, **themed costumes and body props** are encouraged and make up approx 17% of the marking criteria.
- **Costumes will only be judged at the National Final.**
- Body props only. **NO set props.** Props may include hats, face paint, masks, hand held cardboard cut outs etc.

### Staging

- For the Video and National Final, please allow a maximum 6m wide x 6m deep.
- For the National Final, practice your team's entry and exit from both sides of the stage when rehearsing as entry and exit sides TBA. **NB: At the National final when your schools name is called to enter the stage you have a maximum of 30 seconds before the music will start. Time limits will be adhered to. The Head Judge has the option of ringing the bell when the time limit has been reached advising the sound technician to start the music. This rule is set in place to avoid long entrance and exits from stage as entry to & exit from the stage is not being judged.**
- You may choose to enter part of your team from one side and part of your team from the other. You will need to inform the stage manager on the day.
- Head Judge reserves the right to restart music to a routine should they genuinely feel the team is at a disadvantage in any way ie: slippery stage due to sweat, glitter, accidentally trip on entry, music glitches etc. **NOT** a fear of performing or stage fright.

### Judges

- Video Entry Head Judge & moderator Brett Fairweather, JUMP JAM Trainers & invited judges. Judges decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.



#### **FAQ**

**If we qualify for the National Final can we substitute a team member for another?**

Yes.

**If we qualify for the National Final can we subtract team members?**

Yes, remember your team must be a minimum of 6 members. **TIP** Have you thought about a reserve for your team? This may be helpful should something happen to one of your team members especially if you are a team of 6.

**If we qualify for the National Final can we add more team members? e.g. start with 6 in Video entry and wish to add another 6 for Nationals.**

No, as this would be an unfair advantage as 6 team members are easier to synchronize (50% of score in Video entry) and 12 team members in the final tend to fair better with changes to choreography patterns / interaction. If a team member is unexpectedly sick or unavailable on the day of filming please phone us on 0800 348543.

**Can we buy a copy of previous years National Final DVD?**

**Can we put several entries on the one Video/DVD?**

Yes if they are from the same year category. No if from different year categories.

**What is your best piece of advice?**

Use the video camera in rehearsals from day one. Hone your cameraman skills so you finish with a filming presentation you will be happy submitting. Through filming, let the students assess themselves (judge using the marking sheet).

**Can our school enter more than one team in the same category?**

Yes. However if you enter for example 2 teams in the Yr 1, 2, 3, 4 category and place 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>, only the higher scoring 3<sup>rd</sup> placed team will qualify to go to nationals from your school.

**Can our school enter more than one team in different categories?**

Yes

**Can we swap team members between different team entries?** If schools want to enter more than 1 team, and you wish to use the same students from another team, a maximum of 2 students can swap from 1 team to another. i.e.: If you wish to have an All Boy's Team and a mixed team you can only have 2 boys from the Boy's Team in the mixed team.

**What does OPEN Category mean for 2010?**

**OPEN** is defined as any school that has made a National Final in 2008 or 2009 in the category they are entering in 2010. (See list of schools attached on page ten and eleven). **Please note: Years 2-6 Category in previous years now translates in 2010 to Years 4-6 Category**

**What does NOVICE Category mean for 2010?**

**NOVICE** is defined as a school that's **NEVER** qualified to be in the National Final in 2008 or 2009 in the category they are entering for in 2010. Please note, your school may have qualified to be in the National Final either 2008 or 2009 National final in say the Yr 2-6 category, however in 2010 you wish to enter a Yr 7 & 8 team, so you would enter as a **NOVICE** in this category. **Please note: Years 2-6 Category in previous years now translates in 2010 to Years 4-6 Category.**

**Why have you changed the number of teams that make the Nationals in 2010 from previous years in some categories?**

In 2010 we are again taking 50 teams. Our philosophy is to give more opportunities to more schools especially if they haven't competed at National level, hence the top 15 will be invited in the large Novice sections of Yr 4-6 and only the top 5 from other categories (which also reflects that they have far less entries to start with).

## **CATEGORY DEFINITIONS FOR THE JUMP JAM CHALLENGE 2010**

### **Year 1,2,3,4 NOVICE:**

To enter a team in the Year 1,2,3,4 NOVICE category, **your team must consist of at least 50% either Year 1, 2 OR 3 with the remaining 50% Year 4 students.** In other words you cannot have the majority consisting of Year 4 students. Of course you may also have a team of only Year 1 or 2 or Year 3 students. For example, a team of 12 must have at least 6 either Year 1, 2, 3 students with the remaining 6 being Year 4. A team of 9 must have a minimum of 5 either Year 1, 2, 3 students with the remaining 4 being Year 4. **NOVICE** is defined as a school that's **NEVER** qualified to be in the National Final in 2008 or 2009 in the category they are entering for 2010.

**Principal validation is required for entry into this category to ensure that you have the correct year numbers.**

### **Year 1,2,3,4 OPEN:**

To enter a team in the Year 1,2,3,4 OPEN category, **your team must consist of at least 50% either Year 1, 2 OR 3 with the remaining 50% Year 4 students.** In other words you cannot have the majority consisting of Year 4 students. Of course you may also have a team of only Year 1 or 2 or Year 3 students. For example, a team of 12 must have at least 6 either Year 1, 2, 3 students with the remaining 6 being Year 4. A team of 9 must have a minimum of 5 either Year 1, 2, 3 students with the remaining 4 being Year 4. **OPEN** is defined, as a school that has competed in this category in 2008 or 2009 at the JUMP JAM National Final.

### **Year 4-6 Primary NOVICE:**

Teams in this category can consist of students **between Year 4 and Year 6.** This means that **teams can be mixed between these year levels, or they can be made up of one year level only**, eg: Year 5 students only. **NOVICE** is defined as a school that's **NEVER** qualified to be in the National Final in 2008 or 2009 in the category they are entering for 2010. Please note, your school may have qualified to be in the National Final in either the 2008 or 2009 National final in say the Yr 1,2,3,4 category, however in 2010 you wish to enter a Yr 4-6 team, so you would enter as a **NOVICE** in this category. **Please note: Years 2-6 Category in previous years now translates in 2010 to Years 4-6 Category.**

### **Year 4-6 Primary OPEN:**

Any Year 4-6 Primary School that has competed in the category Years 2-6 in 2008 or 2009 at the JUMP JAM National Final must enter this category. Also any school that competed in the 2-6 **NOVICE** category at the 2009 JUMP JAM National Final must enter this category **(See list of schools on page ten)** **Please note: Years 2-6 Category in previous years now translates in 2010 to Years 4-6 Category.**

### **Year 4-6 Primary All Boy's Team:**

**Any Year 4-6 Whole Boys Team** may enter this category. This means that **teams can be mixed between these year levels, or they can be made up of one year level only**, eg: Year 5 boys only.

### **Yr 7/8 Full Primary/Intermediate NOVICE:**

Teams in this category can be **mixed Year 7 and Year 8, or the same year level**, eg: Year 7 students only. **NOVICE** is defined as a school that's **NEVER** qualified to be in the National Final in 2008 or 2009 in the category they are entering for 2010. Please note, your school may have qualified to be in the National Final in either the 2008 or 2009 National final in say the Yr 2-6 category, however in 2010 you wish to enter a Yr 7-8 team, so you would enter as a **NOVICE** in this category.

### **Year 7/8 Full Primary/Intermediate OPEN:**

Any Year 7 & 8 Full Primary/Intermediate school that has competed in this category in 2008 or 2009 at the JUMP JAM National Final must enter this category. Also any school that competed in the 7&8 **NOVICE** category at the 2009 JUMP JAM National Final must enter this category **(See list of schools on page eleven)**

### **Year 7/8 Full Primary/Intermediate All Boys Team :**

**Any Year 7-8 Whole Boys Team** may enter this category. This means that **teams can be mixed between these year levels, or they can be made up of one year level only**, eg: Year 7 boys only.
